Lecture Plan

minute presentation, summarizing the progress and the future plans of one's own research, or recent advances in the research field.

Participants are expected to ask questions and give comments on the presentations in order to promote lively discussions as well as to foster their own understanding.

* The presentation file should be sent to participants by noon on the day before the colloquium.

* The presentation slides must be prepared in English. It is highly encouraged that the talks be given in English. The only exceptions are the first talks by the 1st-year students.

* Students who will be absent or cannot show up on time due to official circumstances must notify the organizers in advance (no later than the day before the colloquium).

Location

Lecture room at NAOJ's Mitaka Campus, or meeting room at each branch. Remote attendance from other locations may be approved by the organizers in certain cases. However, given the current situation of COVID-19, the classes are held online until further notice.
